

# Teesdale and Weardale Search and Rescue Team Newsletter May 2006

## Recent Call outs

**4/3/06** Search for missing female in the coastal area near Peterlee. Coastguard search teams and police helicopter also involved. Two SARDA dogs and search teams deployed. The weather was very cold. The search stood down after 4 hours with nothing found. Missing woman turned up safe outside of search area early the following morning.

**10/3/06 18.30 hrs** Police request to search for 14 year old vulnerable girl missing since before dark, in Easington area. Search stood down at 20.30 hrs when she turned up safe well outside search area. 16 Team members attended along with 1 SARDA dog.

**14/3/06 02.00 hrs** Request by Police to assist in search for despondent male missing from home in Darlington - one Team SARDA dog and support group deployed in initial response. Missing person returned home safe as search about to start.

**19/3/06** Team called to assist with the evacuation of a female walker. The walker had a suspected leg fracture and was in a wooded ravine near Westgate in Weardale. Stanhope fire crew also attended and the casualty was evacuated to a waiting Air Ambulance.

**23/3/06 05.00 hrs** Team called to Cumbria to assist in search for missing 74 year old male in area at foot of Pennine fells. Search lead by Kirby Stephen SMRT and Penrith MRT. Keswick MRT, Kendal MRT, Patterdale MRT, RAF Leeming MRT and Moffat MRT also attended along with SARDA Lakes and RAF Seaking. Search stood down at 15.30 hrs. **25/3/06** Search continued. Team searched area around High Cup Nick. 17 other MRT's and 120 personnel involved, in addition to 3 RAF Seakings. Search controlled by Penrith MRT and Kirby Stephen SMRT. The missing mans body was found some time later by a fell walker outside the search area.

**1/4/06 20.25 hrs request** by Police to search for a 59 year old male missing from home. Believed to be despondent. Mobile phone call traced to area of open ground near Shildon - search commencing when he was found on a road and taken to hospital. 1 Team SARDA dog also attended.

**2/4/06 12.50** Team called by the Police to person taken ill at High Force waterfall. Initial on scene reports indicated need for mountain rescue assistance. Team stood down en route, when Air ambulance was able to evacuate casualty.

**9/4/06 13.30 hrs** Request by Police to attend Cow Green reservoir, following report of a male with arm injuries following a fall. Weather was cold with frequent snow showers. Incident had taken place on Cauldron Snout and the injured man was assisted by passing walkers. Team en route, along with ambulance and Air ambulance. Casualty evacuated by helicopter - assisted by one Team member.

**10/4/06** A teenage girl went missing from her home in Newton Aycliffe at 19.00 on Sunday 9th April. The Team were called mid afternoon the following day and searched the open and scrub land surrounding and near the missing girls home. In addition to police dogs the Team deployed three SARDA dogs. Nothing was found - Team stood down to await further developments. Girl found safe outside search area the following day.

**23/4/06 14.00 hrs** Team on exercise when called by the Police to assist at High Force waterfall following reports of a person with a broken leg. Ambulance and Air ambulance also attending. Team stood down en route as person evacuated by Ambulance.

**9/5/06** Request by Police to search for missing 35 year old male near Peterlee. Search of a local Dene, comprising steep, wooded and difficult terrain. Two Team SARDA dogs also attended along with support from Police helicopter. Nothing found and search stood down at 21.30 hrs.

**Trailer:** The Team have now sourced a replacement trailer. The trailer is an ex RAF/Military Sankey Trailer. The history of these trailers goes back a long way with the armed forces. They were specifically designed for use in hard driving terrain and to be pulled by Land Rovers. The plan is that the trailer (when it has had some renovation) will park in a position that allows the driver of the Land Rover to hitch up the trailer without the need of further assistance. There are three support legs which will be placed in a position to keep the towing eye level with the jaws on the back of the Land Rover, then all you do is reverse up to it. No hauling the trailer around needed. The wheels are Land Rover sized and therefore the spare from our Land Rover can be used in the event of a flat tyre.

The purpose of this trailer will be for all the gear that we have to have readily available but only use occasionally eg. caving gear, stakes, etc. There will be discussion with specific officers in the Team regarding this process of change.

However, in the mean time the trailer needs a little work to make it presentable, so if anyone is keen to help let Anthony the Transport Officer know. Help is especially needed for wiring, rubbing down and welding, so if any of you are qualified please let Anthony know (see web for details)
